

Proposed Measures for the 2019-2020 Brown Marmorated Stink Bug Season

What's changed?

BMSB Seasonal Measures are now consistent with New Zealand:

For the 2019-2020 BMSB risk season, measures will apply to:

- Certain goods manufactured in, or shipped from a target risk country; and/or
- Vessels that berth at, load or tranship from a target risk country

from 1st September 2019 and that arrive in Australian Territory by 31st May 2020 (inclusive).

Safeguarding Arrangements:

A new Safeguarding Arrangements Scheme will allow certain goods and supply chains to be recognised under safeguarding arrangements. Under the scheme, approved participants will be recognised for their ability to manage biosecurity risk offshore, including hitchhiker pest risk such as BMSB, from the point of manufacture to the point of embarkation. The scheme will be trialled with select industry participants before being opened to all other industry participants. More information on the scheme will be provided by the Department of Agriculture in due time.

Offshore Treatment Providers:

Treatment providers that were recognised under the scheme during the 2018-2019 season must complete a renewal application in order to be acceptable for the 2019-2020 season.



What hasn't changed?

Target High Risk Goods' and 'Target Risk Goods':

The Department has not added or removed any HS codes for this season, with the main focus still on machinery and equipment.

Mandatory treatment will still be required for 'Target High Risk Goods', whilst 'Target Risk Goods' will be selected randomly for inspection and possible onshore treatment.

The Target High Risk Goods are:

Treatment Options:

The acceptable treatment methods are the same for this year for both offshore and onshore:

- Heat Treatment
- Methyl Bromide
- Sulphuryl Fluoride
